# What is available at Newstead Abbey for you to enjoy?

Steeped in over 800 years of history, Newstead is a monastic Abbey from the late 12th century and former home of Romantic poet Lord Byron.

Boasting 300 acres of parkland, you can explore the gardens, lake and beautiful estate.

Newstead's parkland owes much of its beauty to the River Leen, feeding the lakes, ponds and cascades that ornament its gardens, along with its wildlife of peacocks and swans.

- Drop-in gardening session.

- Grounds and garden visit and/or Historic house visit.

### **Entry charges:**

<u>Site Entry:</u> £6 parking, £2 for walkers or cyclists.

<u>Historic House Admission:</u> £12 adult, children go free (15 and under).

#### **Travel:**

The Pronto bus to Mansfield from Nottingham's Victoria Centre drops off at the main entrance to Newstead Abbey.

Chesterfield Timetable

The Robin Hood Line runs from Nottingham to Worksop – via Newstead Village. There is a 1 mile walk from the station to the Abbey. For timetables and fares, visit <u>East Midlands Trains</u> or call 03457 125 678.

Newstead Abbey is located 12 miles north of Nottingham on the A60 close to Junction 27 of the M1. Heading from the M1, follow signs for Sherwood Forest and brown signs thereafter. The postcode for your sat nay is NG15 9HJ.

Public transport will stop at the main entrance. Please be aware there is a mile long drive to the main house and meeting point. The driveway is not suitable for wheelchairs and mobility scooters.

There is a car park and dedicated car parking zone for blue badge holders. However, the house and grounds both have some wheelchair access restrictions. There are a considerable number of steps around the Historic house, unfortunately due to the historic nature of the building there are no lifts. Wheelchair access is to the shop and cloisters only.
