



Taylor Review Pilot Evaluation

Evaluation is a key part of the Taylor Review Pilot



Example evaluation questions

- 1. Does the pilot help listed places of worship to understand the importance of maintenance and implement maintenance plans?
- 2. Does the pilot help listed places of worship to better engage with their communities?
- 3. How effective is the minor repairs grant in delivering maintenance and repair that would not otherwise have been possible?
- 4. Has it been possible to deliver the pilot as planned? What needed to change and why?
- 5. What level of resource may be needed if a similar approach were rolled out nationally after the pilot?



Facilitates valuable learning about what outcomes were achieved (relative to what would have happened anyway), for whom, and what could be improved upon






At this early stage we are reporting initial evidence on five main themes





There has been a high level of engagement with the pilot overall, with some differences in the type of engagement between pilot areas





Total number of places of worship engaged by faith/denomination (to March 2019)



The speed of the grant process and FSO support has been highly valued by places of worship...

...and the pilot is resulting in maintenance and minor repairs happening earlier






"[without the grant] minor repair issues would only have been addressed approximately **2-3 years** further down the line ... but would have been more of a piecemeal approach if undertaken at all."


"without this support, the church would have had to learn the hard way ... it would likely have taken a couple of failed grant attempts to learn, and people may have lost heart.

Examples of community engagement ideas developed with the pilot support

All Saints Church, Barton upon Irwell

- Engaged with CDA and attended the Places of Worship and the Wider Community workshop.
- The place of worship has developed a list of new community engagement ideas to take forward.



St. Michael's Church, Hunston

- Engaged with the CDA
- Attended a 'drop-in' session with the CDA, FSO and Diocese
- The PCC has implemented a plan to open the church once a month in the summer.
