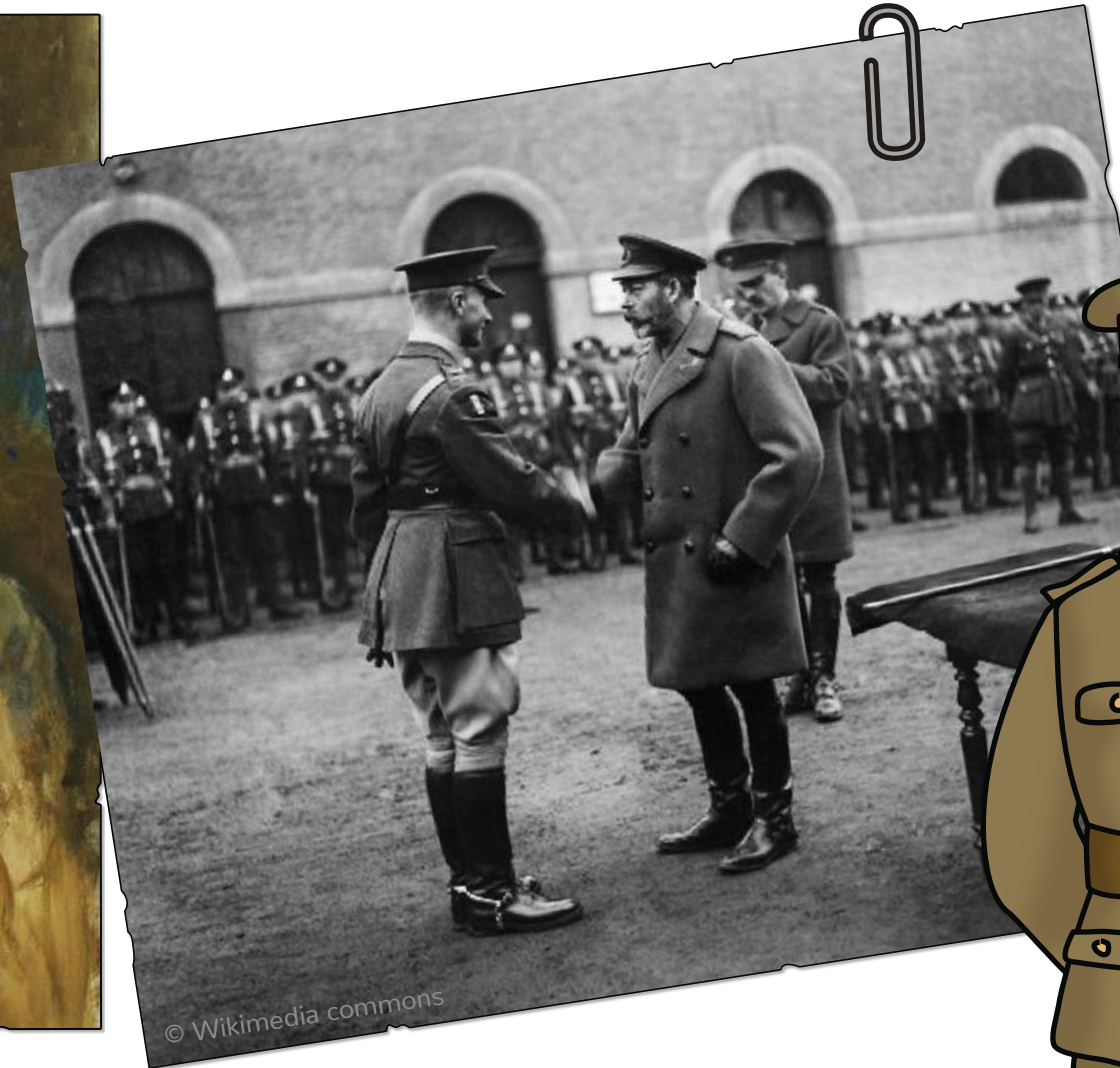

Name: Daniel Marcus William Beak

Date of Birth: 27th Jan 1891

Place of Birth: 42 Kent Rd, St Denys, Southampton, Hants.

Family: Son of William Henry Beak, master dairyman and Sarah Ann (née Mullin).

Profession/Job: trained as teacher and worked at St Mary's, Southampton; then sec to Bristol clergyman: British Army officer. Final rank: Honourable Major General

Address: Military residence: RN Depot (Reservists), Crystal Palace, Sydenham, Kent.

Date of death and details: 3rd May, 1967, Swindon, Wiltshire United Kingdom.

Place of burial or memorial and details: Brookwood Cemetery, Woking, Surrey, St Gabriel's Ave, Grave 222960. Name on memorial tablet to his wife, Ayr, Scotland; bronze plaque on Borough War Memorial, Cheltenham, Glos.

Any other details: He was awarded the Distinguished Service Order; Star; British War Medal; Victory Medal with MiD; Star; Africa Star with clasp 8th Army; War Medal with MiD; Jubilee Medal; Coronation Medal; Coronation Medal; VC Investiture, the first Naval VC to receive the medal with red rather than blue ribbon.

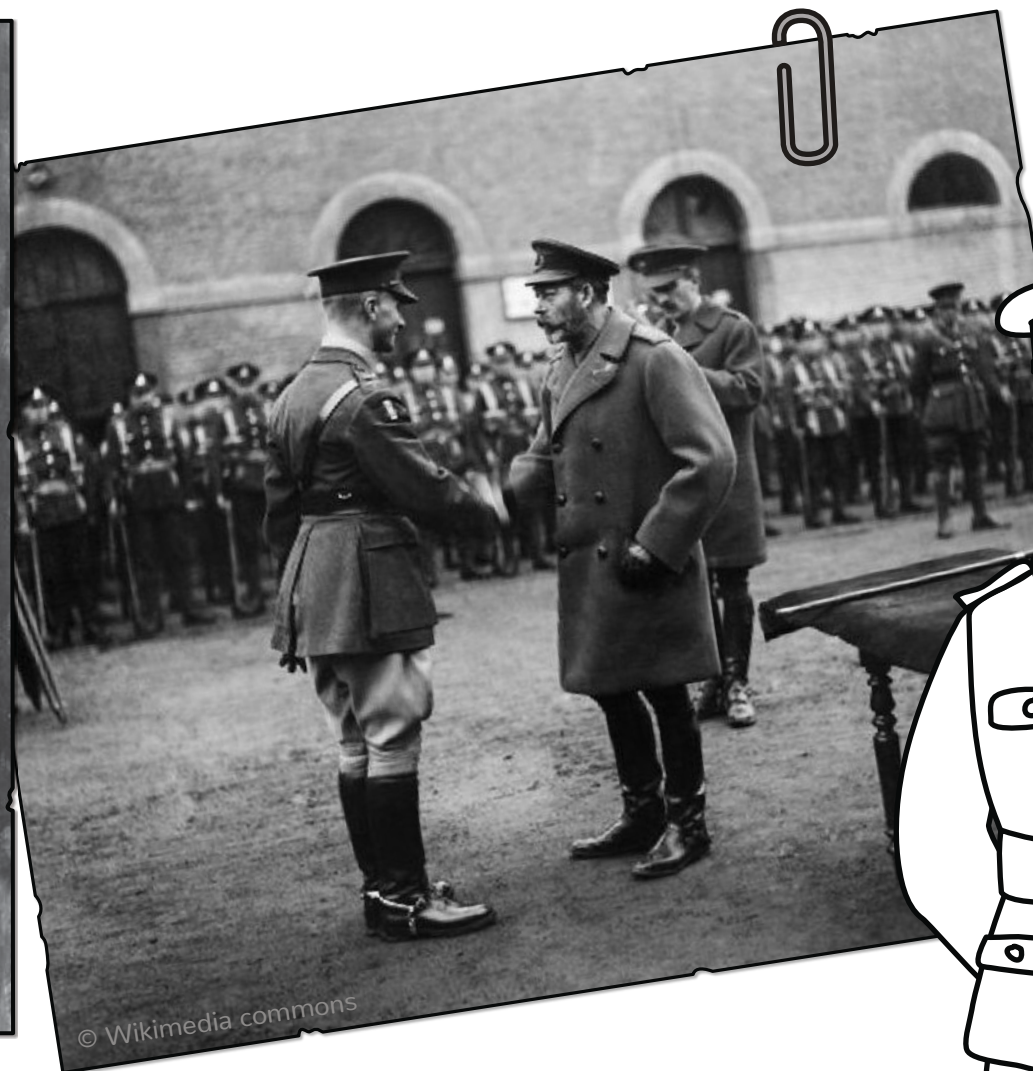
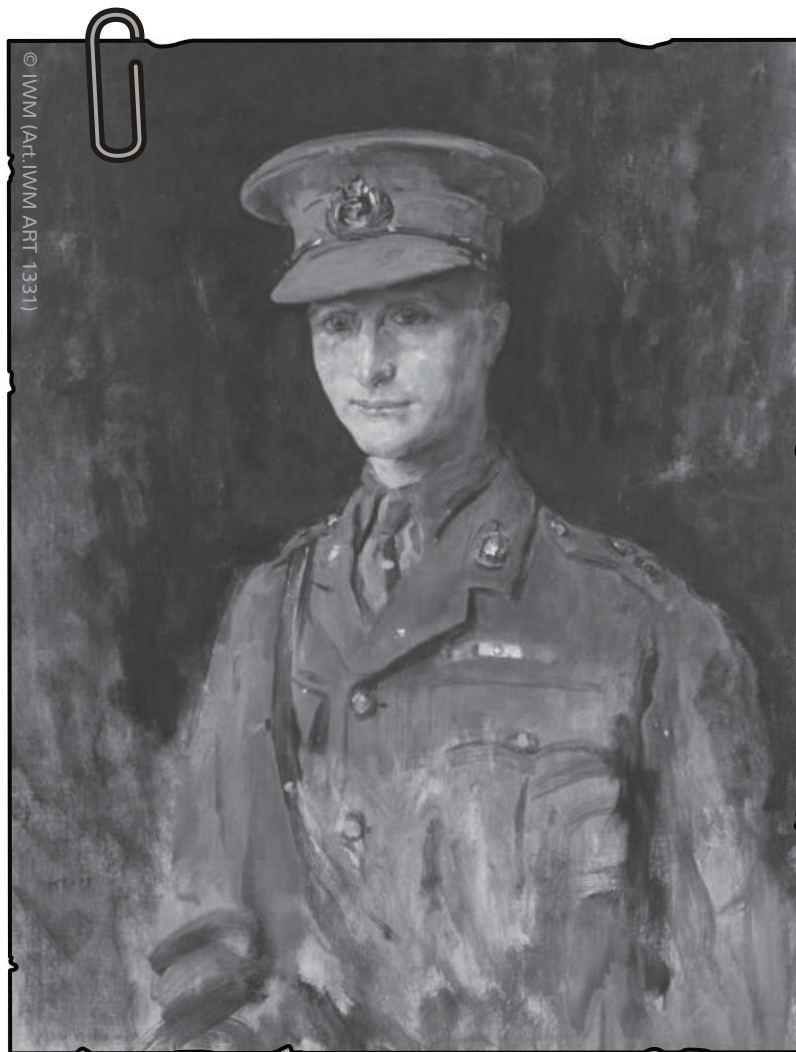
