## How can this research help EH?

As part of the Heritage at Risk programme, English Heritage will be focussing on the industrial heritage theme in 2011.

To inform the launch of 'Industrial Heritage at Risk' in October 2011, English Heritage wish to understand attitudes towards industrial heritage among the public in England.

The objectives of this study were to:

- Assist in national and local media campaigns informing the process of raising the profile of industrial heritage in England;
- Provide evidence of the value of industrial heritage in England, why it is valued and who it is most valued by;
- Help to inform strategic policy around conservation of industrial heritage and solutions for re-use.

Comparisons made with 2009 research of Public Attitudes towards Heritage Protection Designation

BASE: Nationally representative sample of 996 GB adults aged 15 years and over FIELDWORK DATES: 22<sup>nd</sup>-28<sup>th</sup> Jan 2009

Primarily attitudes towards the historic buildings, places and archaeological remains that we have in this country

#### Method

#### Research among a representative sample of the adult population of England



#### Sample of 2,007 interviews achieved

Sufficiently large to allow for significant sample sub-group analysis, particularly geographically

- it was hypothesized opinion would vary notably according to the nature of industrial heritage locally

Interviews conducted online, Respondents recruited from an online panel

To generate the large sample sizes required for this study, which are representative of the demographics of the England population






## Awareness of when the Industrial Revolution took place

When do you think the industrial revolution took place?





Industrial heritage was defined for all respondents up front


#### All are basing their opinions of its value in the same context

"Buildings, sites and landscapes used in the following industries from the start of the Industrial Revolution to the present day with a focus on the period from 1750 to the onset of the First World War:

- Mines and quarries coal, stone, clay, iron etc
- Processing and manufacture, metal industries, textile mills, glassworks, potteries, factories of all kinds, chemical production and food and drink production (including wind and watermills)
- Power and utilities gas works, water and sewage works
- Warehouses associated with processing and manufacture industries
- Transport and communications roads, bridges, canals and waterways, railways, ports docks and airports.





How much do you agree or disagree with the following statements:















# People favour country houses, castles / care more about other sites / more money put into preserving country houses, castles

"Organisations such as English Heritage and The National Trust seem only to be interested in castles, country houses and ancient monuments"

"The likes of Stonehenge and our churches receive far more attention and money for preservation than our industrial ones as the urge to regenerate "old eyesores" leads to more and more of our past being destroyed"

"The industrial north always comes second to the stately home south. The great factories were the palaces of the working class - less elegant, less cultured, but just as much a part of the British way of life"

"People naturally seem to care more about aesthetically pleasing looking heritage sites than industrial ones"

"Millions spent on old houses and palaces for people to roam over and envy. Very little money and even less publicity for where the majority of us come from"

"They do not seem as bothered about our industrial heritage sites, they are not as jaw-droppingly glamorous and visually appealing"

Lack of education on industrial heritage

"I don't believe the younger generation care for such things. This attitude, mainly through lack of education on the subject"



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








#### What are the guidelines that we might apply?

When does the public believe we should:

#### Reuse, preserving the character?

- When the original external structure remains intact
- When it is financially viable solid, large structures
- When they generate local identity unique local characteristics







When does the public believe we should:

#### Preserve as museums or conserved monuments?

- When they are a 'classic' or 'rare' example of type
- When they have appeal as a visitor attraction visually impressive, engaging to experience, financially viable
- When they have particular educational value







### What are the guidelines that we might apply?

When does the public believe we could: Reuse, without preserving the character? (but never the preferred option)

- When far from unique many local examples
- If too 'far gone' to cost effectively preserve character
- When it is not visually appealing
- When it is more cost effective to reuse than demolish



When does the public believe we should: **Leave to decay?** 

- When they are features which enhance rural landscapes
- ....and are already beyond repair and viable for reuse







.....and **demolishing** is <u>never</u> the preferred option for any example

"What is the point of teaching history when there is no evidence of it??"

"Because they look like they were **part of our heritage** like docks, mills etc which should be used to teach future generations about industry"

"Some of them have their own **unique style** ...but on the whole because I believe in the importance of history as a **reminder of things we have achieved** and as a **valuable teaching** tool for the younger generation"

'We need to be educated and learn about the industries which existed in England in the past so we find out about the working lives etc of our ancestors"

"It is our history and should not be allowed to be lost or confined to books and pictures"

"It is very difficult to convey the sense of being to young children- they would prefer to experience it for themselves"

"Because they are a unique opportunity to show future generations how the United Kingdom developed"

"I think it is important to retain **tangible** evidence of our past"





Why is Reuse, preserving character AND/OR Preserve, to remind us of our industrial past considered overall most appropriate conservation outcomes...

# **Importantly** stop them being destroyed / lost

'Every effort should be made to at least keep these sites stable and not decay. They are all important and need to be kept, after all, once they are gone, they are gone"

"They all form part of our national and cultural identity - the policy of 'Bulldoze and Build 'should be outlawed - if the Europeans adopted this policy then history and heritage would be meaningless"

#### They are unique

"Because they all have their **uniqueness** that would disappear forever if their character wasn't retained"

"These are very unique examples of the past"

"Because they are important and unique landmarks"

"They appear to be **'unique'** (or rare examples) of their type which it would be a shame to lose"

"They are **unique** structures that need to be preserved for future generations, as seeing photos cannot convey properly what they were"

'They are such lovely and **unique** building and structures, so I feel their character should be preserved"

Museums and historical sites can be interesting places to visit

"They are all wonderful examples which are part of our history and heritage, and future generations should be able to see them and experience the way of life in the periods depicted"



"A Windmill would visually impressive from the exterior and also the workings would be simple to explain. The brewery would be interesting from a local historical point"

"They have had a defined purpose, they can teach us about our historical past by bringing into use as a working museum"

"The buildings appear to be unique and original, and as if they could tell a story"



#### Why should sites be reused ensuring their character is preserved (specifically)















**Impressive/ Attractive structure** 

Economical way to preserve & maintain them

Still solid structures/ large spaces lend themselves to being re-used

Allow them to serve a useful purpose again

"Easy to convert buildings with a solid structure and visually interesting"

"Distinctive structures that could teach people about earlier ways of life"

"They may not offer much historical need, but can provide unique shopping or residential use"

"The architecture of the buildings exterior is impressive and would suit reusing"

"Impressive buildings with a lot of character and a lot of scope for modern use"

"The buildings are **far too impressive to let them decay.** They could easily be renovated but without destroying the outside facade"

"They look like they could be used in such a way, and are **not sufficiently unique to require complete preservation**"

"Still solid structures so **save demolition and clearance costs** internally spacious allowing style and design without compromise"

"Good solid structures crying out to be reused"





# ...Preserve OR Re-use maintaining character

"If left un-restored the buildings will become derelict and over time will have to be pulled down. By giving them a renewed purpose they will stay standing for many more years whilst still retaining the character that makes them historically interesting. As much as turning buildings into museums is a nice idea, there's only so many "mill museums", "factory museums" you can have. It's often the look of the building that's so important to preserve, what happened inside can be recorded elsewhere if necessary. Once a building/feature is gone, it's gone for good"

# ...what are the reasons for exception Why should sites be reused without necessarily preserving their character

If a site is **NOT** unique

If cost to preserve is not worth the benefit

If its not practical to do so

If sites not aesthetically pleasing

Structurally sound, large spaces that should be put to good use

"Because they look just the same as some buildings that are used nowadays so nothing significant or different about these buildings"

"They don't seem sufficiently unique and aesthetically pleasing to require their preservation if that prevents sensible re-use"

"Frankly they look too far gone to be worth the effort unless they are unique"

"Sites that are not unique and are too far gone to renovate need to be used for other things"

"There is no history character is these buildings and I don't think a lot people will interest of it. It is too ugly and will cost a lot to conserved them"

"These buildings are in good locations with big land. If they are refurnished, they can be reused for modern day purposes"

"None of these are particular 'nice' buildings so have no real character to preserve but, if the structure is sound, they should be reused rather than just razed to the ground"

"These ones are functional and didn't have much character to begin with"

...but this option was not considered most appropriate conservation outcome for any example shown, suggesting this should be a last resort

"To be re-used even if character is not kept is better surely than falling down and losing everything"



#### Statistical difference

This research was designed to ensure robust sample sizes for analysis

As the survey is conducted with a sample of the target audience, we cannot be 100% certain that a census of the whole population would yield the same results

We can be <u>95%</u> certain that the <u>actual</u> figure (in the population as a whole) falls within a certain range of the survey figure

The percentages within the table represent the error variance




What industrial heritage sites are there in the local area where you live?





How much do you agree or disagree with these statements about the industrial heritage sites in the local area where you live?










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
How much do you agree or disagree with these statements about the industrial heritage sites in the local area where you live?









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
