## Site I7

A skull of neolithic or bronze age date was found in a pit in the side of the ring ditch. It was thin with no strong features and so was probably that of a female. Three molars and one premolars were present and from their wear an age of 17-25 years can be estimated.

A group of bones from the ditch fill was also examined. They were frequented but most of both arms and legs were present together with a few wits of skull and relvis. The bones were those of an adult (the spinhyses had all fused,, and from their size probably came from a female.

## . . F.

Tric was a poorly calcined cremation which also contained two fragments of one consecut. The bone fragments were mainly from the long benes out some pieces of skull were preserved too. Average size was 1-2 cm. The remains are part of at least one individual, probably adult.

## . I'.

This was mother poorly calcined cremation. Skull and long bones are represented. The remains are part of at least one individual, probably moult.
