ROMAN VILLA, Hill Farm, Gestingthorpe, Essex.

If iron ore was being used in large amounts it would have has to be imported to the site. There is a little ironore in the Clahaven and Blackheath Beds (Bocene) near Canterbury, some in the Corallian (Jurassic) at Dover, in the wealden of the heald, and, of course there is the Northampton bronstone some distance away. On the other hand concretionary masses of Limonite have been found in the Red Crag (Plicene) of the Budbury area which could have supplied ore for a limited amount of smelting at Gestingthorpes.

As for the sandstone slabs (vide the fragment you sent me) these could have come from the Clacial Arift but they are very like 'Sarsens', as those were derived by the weathering of the Reading Beas, the lower beds of the London Clay and the Estant sends they could occur in the Surbury area. Large blocks of Hertfordshire Puddingstone are sometimes found in association with 'Estans' and I seem to remember seeing some 'Fuddingstone' at Gestingthorpe.
