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Carbonised plant remains comprising mainly cereal grain was analysed from three contexts.

1) Context GNWD80 Area II WEST 27(1). Drying Kiln.

Triticum aestivum L. 440 caryopses.

Avena sativa L. 27 caryopses.

Pisum sativum var. arvense(L) Poir 8 seeds.

2) Context GNVD 80 Area II WEST 27(2) Drying kiln.

Triticum aestivum L. 1028 caryopses.

Triticum aestivum L. 2 internodes.

Avena sativa L. 29 caryopses.

Pisum sativum var. arvense (L) Poir. 9 seeds.

3) Context GNWD 80 Area II East 108 (417) Cess Pit bottom fill.

Triticum aestivum type. 43 caryopses.

Avena sativa L. 8 caryopses.

Pisum sativum var. arvense (L) 2 seeds.

All contexts contained <u>Triticum aestivum</u> type which was identified specifically to <u>T. aestivum L.</u> (bread wheat) in contexts 27 (1) and 27(2) by the small number of intermode fragments included in the population. <u>Triticum aestivum type</u> in 108 (417) is likely to be referable to this species also. All contexts contained <u>Avena sativa L.</u> (Common or cultivated oat). and the Field cultivated pea, Pisum sativum var. arvense (L) Poir. although in lower frequensies.

In addition to the above crop types, a number of seed types were recorded.

Predominant amongst these was Anthemis cotula L. in the main chamber (68 acheres in 27(1) and 518 in 27(2)). These may also be associated with carbonised florets of cf. Anthemis cotula L. (numerous fragments). This taxon (Stinking Mayweed) is typical of arable land and waste places and as such might be expected in such close association with cereal remains.

Folygonum aviculare L. (Knotgrass) is similarly typical of arable habitats and seeds were also recorded (13) in 27(2).
