Bag 1. CHT 72 250.5 x 50.8 in F 9.3/11/74

Cattle

Two individuals: - (a) a fragment of the left humerus of an adult animal about one year of age at death, (b) a fragment of horn core and skull of an adult animal.

Sheen

Unner third molar - unerunted, lower second molar erunyted but unworm. One rib fragment. These are probably all of one animal aged about one year at the time of death.

Domestic Fowl

The third metacarnal and sternum all probably from one individual.

Bag 2. S.E. 72 250.5 x 51 in $\mathbb{F}[9]$ L (2) 4/11/72

<u>Jattle</u>

At least two individuals are present:— (a) an adult animal represented by a left humanus and horn core fragment, (b) the distal embhisear condyles of a left metatarsal, the right and left humani with unfused distal embhisis and a jaw (right) all combining to give an age at death of less than $1\frac{1}{2}$ years. Also present, a long bone fragment showing charing by fire. This could have occurred during or after cooking.

Sheep

An adult lower first premolar and an upper first molar. Represential, one animal.

Pig

One accessory metanocial giving an age at death of three years.

Lenus euroneus

A single right hunerus of an adult animal

Bag 3. CHT 72 250.3 x 51 in 19 L(I) 5/11/72

Cattle

At least two individuals are present (a) a fragment of a juvenile right humerus. (b) fragments of an adult right humerus, second fore phalanx and a rib fragment.

Sheen

At least one incividual, represented by the right and left femura and a proximal ulna fragment; all of which were from an adult animal and had the appearance of recent interment.
