

The Human Bones from Morningthorpe, Norfolk

One cremation was examined in the laboratory; the minimum number of individuals was estimated as one. It was large, well fragmented and cremated, and was of an adult, based on epiphyseal fusion (Brothwell 1981). Only the skull, one vertebral fragment and the lower appendicular skeleton was represented. This may have been due to the fragmentary nature of the material or to the selective collection of the bones after cremation.

No further observations were possible.
