Both of these single-handled ring-necked flagons (not amphorae), no. 1 slightly smaller than the other, are in a soft sandy fabric, light buff (Munsell 7.5YR 8/6) in colour. Thin sectioning and study under the petrological microscope shows little except frequent grains of quartz, flecks of mica and a little plagioclase feldspar, giving no real indication of origins. Both vessels appear to be in a similar fabric. These type of flagons with multiple-ringed necks are common during the first and second centuries A.D. and the variations in form are many.
