			<p>Mostly very small unidentifiable fragments, including small twigs; hazel (<u>Corylus avellana</u>) or alder (<u>Alnus glutinosa</u>). One coal fragment.</p>	C121 F7
			<p>Probably hawthorn-type (<u>Crataegus</u>/<u>Pyrus</u>/<u>Malus</u>/<u>Sorbus</u> sp.) and blackthorn (<u>Prunus</u> sp.), twiggy.</p>	C119 F10

			<p>Probably blackthorn, mainly twiggy.</p>	C113 F14
			<p>Probably hawthorn-type and hazel/alder, mainly twiggy. A few bone fragments.</p>	C111 F1
