

To the S, a range of field boundaries and a platform are visible centred at TA 2395 4200. It is suggested these may represent remains of the medieval village. Three pits are visible laying on an E–W alignment spaced between 24m and 34m apart. It is unclear whether the latter are medieval or more recent in date. Several features were recorded in the cliff face in 2009 including a gravel-filled ditch (TA 237742 42256), the NE end of a small enclosure (TA 23751 42241), a silt-filled ditch (TA 23760 42232), an E-W ditch (TA 23839 42125) and a further ditch (TA 23850 42106). The N end of an earthwork was also recorded at the S end of the complex (TA 23926 41993).
