


Figure 54. Phase 12: Mid/Late 4th Century to ?Early 5th Century. Expansion of the villa (192235) and reorganisation of the settlement.




Figure 56. Phase 12: Building 192040 and associated activity.




Figure 57. Phase 13: ?Early/Mid 5th Century. ©English Heritage.




Figure 59. Phase 14: Medieval activity, including plough furrows and Cotton Lane as shown on the Ordnance Survey 1:2,500 map of 1886.













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
