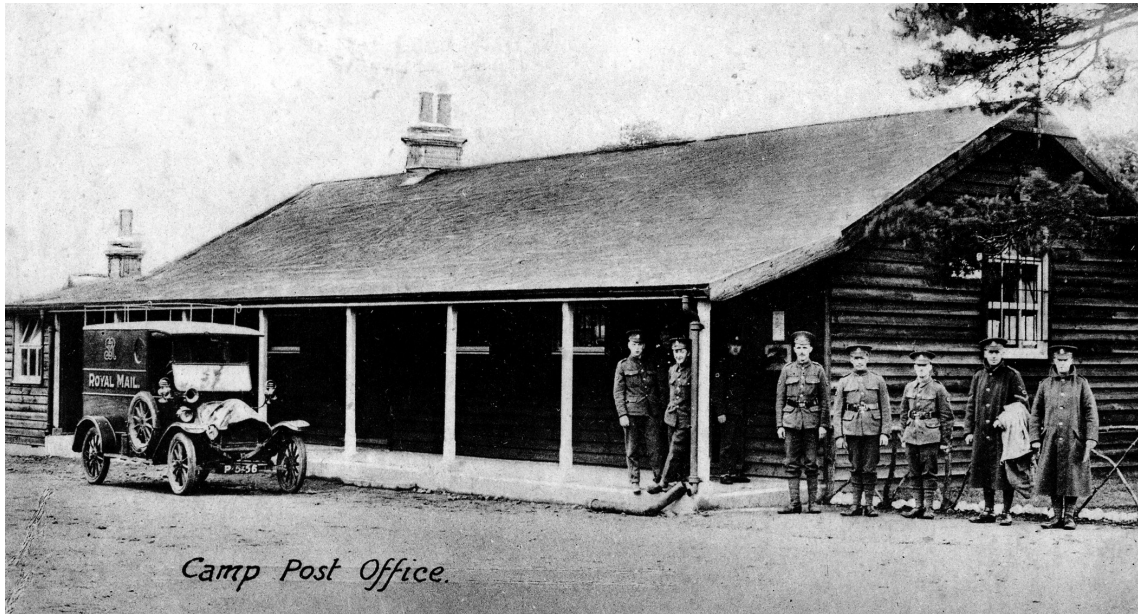

Introduction

This document examines two principal areas of 20th century military history:

- Lists of military camps & barracks in England, the Isle of Man, Scotland and Wales. The vast majority of these are Army related.
- Lists of establishments, including Home Guard, recruitment, training and storage depots that were in existence during the 1940s.

The military camps & barracks lists are based on seven main sources:

- US Army Centre of Military History
- US Army Air Force Lists
- The BBC Peoples War
- The Forces Postal History Society
- Post Cards
- The National Archives (TNA)
- Web Sites

US Army Centre of Military History - Historical Research Branch (USAOSL)

The Center of Military History is located in Building 35 at Fort McNair.

US Army Air Force Lists (AFSL)

The majority of USAAF bases in the UK had a unique Army Air Force Station number. All non-airfield USAAF stations are listed here. The complete list was published on the internet based around an unpublished document by Captain Barry Anderson, USAF, in January 1985.

US Army Installations in the United Kingdom, World War II

This website (<http://freepages.genealogy.rootsweb.com/~herz/trace/>) lists a very large number of appropriate sites. Unfortunately it contains an unacceptable number of typographical errors, and hence must be treated with caution.

BBC People's War (BBC)

The BBC asked the public to contribute their memories of World War Two to a website between June 2003 and January 2006. The result is an archive of 47,000 stories and 15,000 images. Under a search for 'Army Camp', 500 pages were identified with an approximate total of 5,000 entries. Roughly 1,000 entries were inspected but a large number of these relate to army camps abroad, PoW camps and small anti-aircraft gun sites which are not included in this list. Searches were also made of 'Military Hospitals' and 'Army Barracks'. The Web Site is at: bbc.co.uk/ww2peopleswar/.

The Forces Postal History Society (PM)

Pre-WWII Volunteer as well as TF and TA Annual Camps before WWII had one essential thing in common (apart from soldiers) – they all had a YMCA with a Post Office, and as such each camp had a unique post mark. In recent years these have become very collectable, and most collectors of British military postal history are members of the Forces Postal History Society. The main reference work throughout the 1970s and 80s is the Society's book 'Camp Postmarks' of the United Kingdom, by RA Kingston, published in March 1971.

Post cards (PC)

Pre-WWI Volunteer and pre-WWII TF/TA Camps had facilities such as a YMCA tent or hut where post cards could be purchased. These were often real photographs of the camp, taken by a local photographer. Today post cards such as these are very collectable and are an excellent photographic record of buildings and camp life.

Books, TNA records and internet sites

A list of these is found at the end of the document.

Verification

Official records, including those found in TNA, are frequently incorrect, mostly due to typographical issues. The name of a number of locations has changed with time, such as: Caernarvon or Caernarfon and Porth Madoc or Portmadoc. Throughout this document the name that was correct at the time has been used, corrected when necessary, and verified against Ordnance Survey standards.

The internet is a reliable source for misinformation. Typically there are a significant number of 'local-interest' websites in which the even the name of the appropriate parish is spelled incorrectly. Current MoD publications too have problems; the National Asset Register for 2007 describes a certain Lincolnshire airfield as '*RAF Waddingham*' instead of Waddington.

Also, over time, personal memories tend to fade. For example, one entry from the web reads:

"...He then transferred to Great Nissendon. ...He then went to Oxford near Ipswich, ... moved to Bishopstone near Bournemouth."

It should read, *Great Missendon ...Orford*, and, regarding the final location, Bournemouth is misspelled, and it should actually read *Brighton*! Following the initial compilation of sites, around 15% were found to be inaccurate in one way or another. Though errors will still exist, it is hoped that these are minimal.

Three criteria were use in checking the lists:

- Does the location exist ?
- Is it (or was it in certain cases) in the county specified ?
- Did it have a military connection ?

A sizeable number of locations still remained unverified – these are marked with a '?'

The counties described are those existing at the time. Owing to lack of accurate information regarding precise county boundaries it pays to check adjacent counties when checking sites.

The function of a large number of camps changed after D-Day; now no longer used by Allied Forces, they became Prisoner of War camps to house the increasing numbers of Germans shipped over from France and Belgium.

The military units described at each location are representative. No attempt has been made to research the full history of each site. There remains much work to be done in this area.

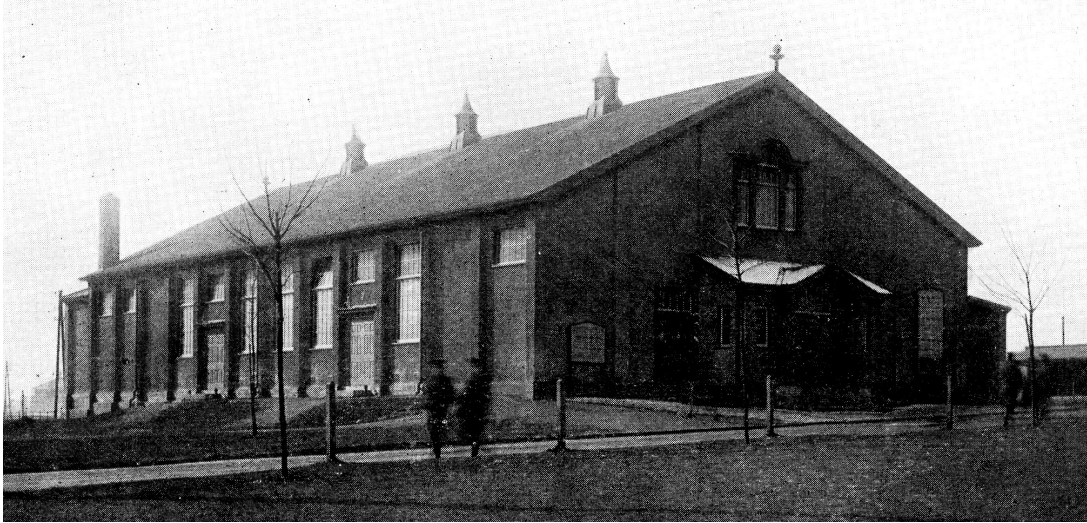


Plate D: Garrison Theatre, Tidworth

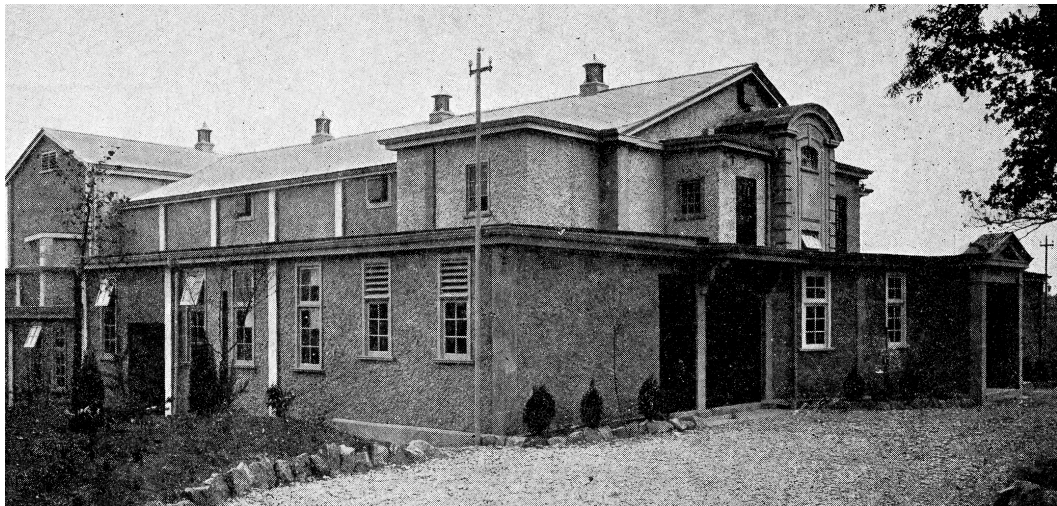


Plate E: Catterick Camp Garrison Theatre

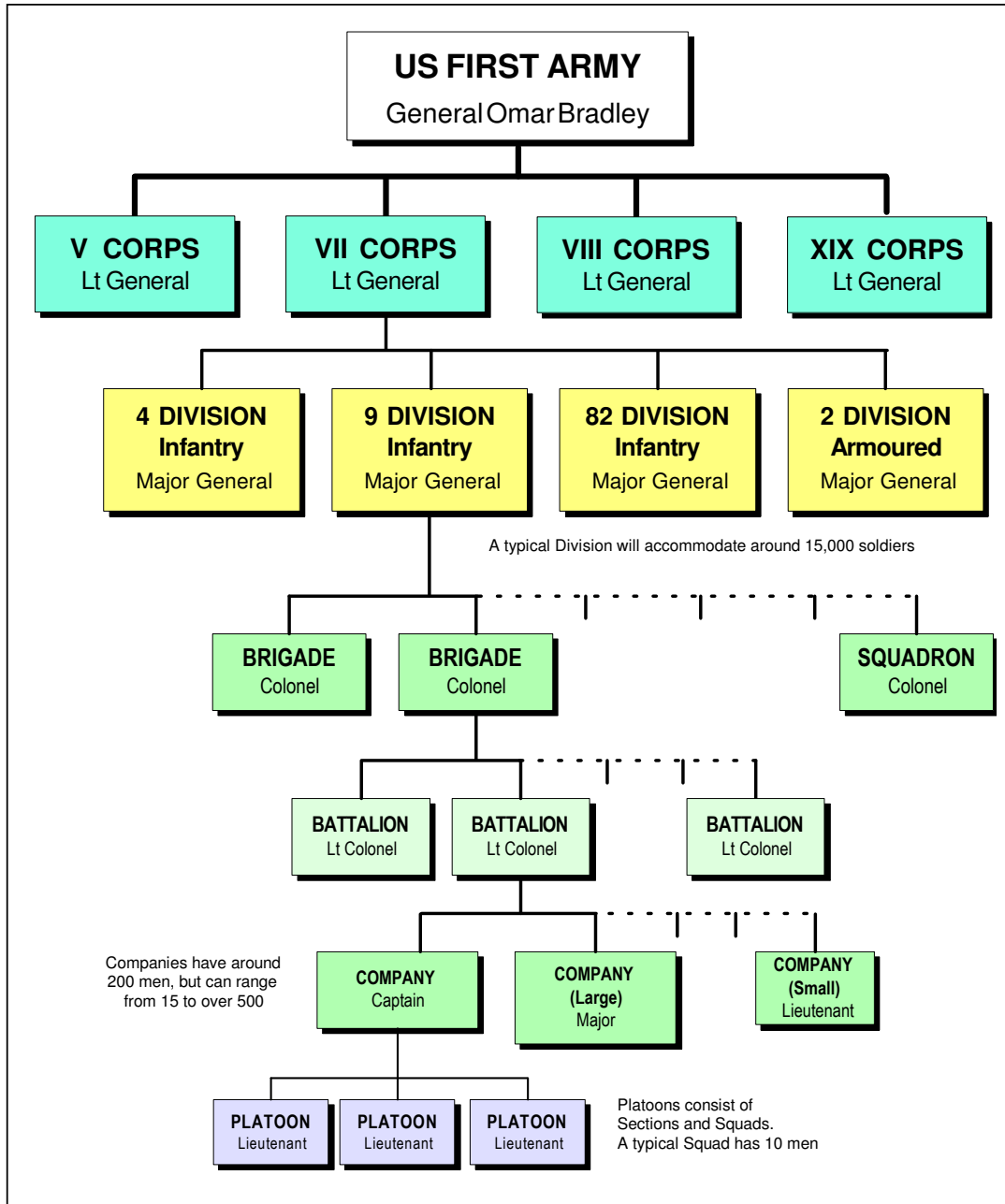

The US Army in the UK - Structure

A very large number of camps were used by American forces. The US First Army began arriving in the UK from October 1943. It was followed by the Third Army in January 1944, and the Ninth in June. All eventually transferred to Europe. These three units became part of an Army Group for overall command. The structure of one unit is shown below.



Grid References

Four, six, or eight figure grid references are quoted for a number of sites in this document, examples being:

Cleave – (SS2012) The double alphabetical character denotes that this is a modern National Grid reference.

Appleton Hall, Stretton – (E0806) The single alphabetical character denotes that this is a pre-1945 Cassini WOFO (War Office, False Origin) coding.

Note that the Cassini reference requires a further alphabetical character, since the UK mainland is divided into four unequal quadrants. These are centred on the NGR SE523800 (roughly Kilburn in North Yorkshire). This extra character is:

- ‘**q**’ for locations north-west of the point
 - ‘**r**’ for the very small area north-east of the point
 - ‘**v**’ for locations south-west of the point
 - ‘**w**’ for locations south-east of the point
- (The Orkney Islands are ‘**l**’; and Shetlands are ‘**l**’ west of Lerwick, ‘**m**’ to the east.

Thus the complete reference for *Appleton Hall* is: vE0806 (NGR SJ6184).

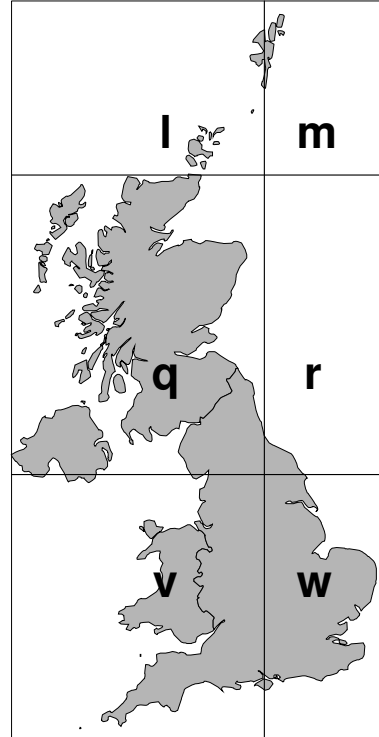

The Volunteer Lists

This report has been compiled from The Volunteer Lists, 1903, 1907 and the Territorial Force List 1911. These were originally published in the Volunteer Service Gazette and the Territorial Service Gazette. The original lists were compiled with the object of giving correct information as to the headquarters and drill stations of the component parts of the scattered Volunteer Corps. This information used to be published in the *Army List*, at least until the system of Administrative Regiments lasted, but since the abolition of that system the details as set out below were only available in the Volunteer / Territorial Service Gazette.
