

ROMAN ?FLAGON NECK FROM CHESTER

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Chester/'Arrowcroft Scheme 1977-9 Excavation' SF44

From the drawing and a macroscopic examination of the small sherd sent as a sample, I have doubts as to whether this is a Dressel 28 amphorae from Baetica in southern Spain as suggested. I should be inclined to regard the vessel as a flagon, but Dressel 28 were made at a number of different places in a variety of fabrics and so it is difficult to be dogmatic about this.
