Area replaced textile, c.6.0 X 2.8 cm, with patches of ?grass stems lying across it; Z,Z, very coarse regular 2/2 twill, count 5-6/8 per cm.

Grave 159

Shimad (715058)

Three fragments textile, replaced on iron on wood, 5.0 X 2.3, 3.3 X 2.3, and 1.7 X 1.6 cm (this on the rim of the boss), Z,Z, 2/2 twill, count 9/9 per cm, regular spinning and weaving.

Grave 228

Bronze tweezers (691132)

On fragment of iron attached, replaced fine Z threads.

Grave 245

Shield boss

Area replaced textile on front surface 9.5 X 4.5 cm, and other smaller patches; Z,Z, 2/2 twill, spinning and weaving both very regular, count 12/11 per cm. Coming from under the twill appears to be a piece of the edge of the textile, curved round and folded under; the twill threads seem to join onto the edge, which is 0.7 cm wide, with 6 lines that may be the thicker warps of a selvedge, or possibly 6 tablet-twists. There is a possible trace of another piece of edge under the opposite corner of the large twill area.

Grave 246

Bronze annular brooch (690933)

Deteriorated textile preserved by bronze, Z and S threads, weave not clear.

Bronze tweezers (690934)

Iron buckle, ?with plate

Area c.5.0 X 5.0 cm replaced textile curving over edge on back of buckle; Z,Z, regular 2/2 twill, count 14/14 per cm.

Iron pin

Replaced textile for length of 3.8 cm along and round the pin, in a double fold on one side, clearest fragment 1.4 X 0.7 cm; Z,Z, twill, regular 2/2 as far as can be seen, surface too bad for count, but c.12/12 per cm. Insect pupae on surface.

Bronze disc brooch

Traces textile, replaced, Z,Z, too deteriorated for weave or count to be seen.

Grave 336

1. Small square-headed brooch

Front: fragment 1.0 X 0.3 cm, dark brown textile, Z,Z, twill, too small and deteriorated for count. Back: round pinhead, deteriorated mass of replaced textile, Z threads.

2. Small square-headed brooch Back: traces of Z threads.

Grave 341

Silver inlaid Frankish purse mount (700160)

Front: fragment replaced textile, c.2.5 X 1.0 cm, Z,Z, 2/2 twill, count 11-12/10 per cm; traces of deteriorated textile on front of discs. Underneath mount, between leather and metal: several layers deteriorated twill, finer, count at least 14-16 threads in each system, perhaps the lining of the leather purse.

Replaced lump of textile, 2.0 X 1.2 cm, in several folds; Z,Z, count 12/16 per cm.

Grave 351

Small annular brooch (715179)

Partly replaced textile both sides of pin, 2.0 X 0.6 front, 2.5 X 1.5 back.

(a) Z,Z, twill, count 6-7/6 on 5 mm. HMA. Fine animal fibres, on some traces of scale margins. The indications are that they are wool.

Front: one clear patch of this twill, replaced 0.7 X 0.6, shows possible break for reverse, but there may be missing threads.

Back: (b) also under twill on front, i.e. the pin (detached) passed through it, Z,Z, plain weave, count 10/12 (6 om 5 mm); a replaced area, 1.0 X 0.6, shows a clear paired thread, either a weaving mistake or ?coloured line; 6 throws preserved one side of paired thread, only 1 other side.

Back: area 0.8 X 0.7 cm, replaced textile; Z,Z, twill, too many threads deteriorated for clear identification, count estimated c.12/12 per cm. Front: fraces Z threads on front of pin.

Grave 374

Square-headed brooch

Back: on pin, replaced textile, several layers, 1.3 X 1.3 cm overall; Z,Z, 1will, 2/2 count c.12/12 (clear area 5 mm, 6/6). Front: coarse threads passing round foot of brooch, very little spinning direction, probably flax. Foot possibly sewn to garment?

Grave 397

Small square-headed brooch

Front: replaced fragment 0.5 X 0.3 cm; Z,Z, plain weave, 6 by 3 threads. Back: deteriorated textile round pin head, Z threads; fragment 1.0 X 0.5 cm on pin catch-plate, replaced, probably same weave as on front.

Front: one fragment of 10 % 0.7 on menlaged 7.7 to twill a seem to be from same 2,2, fine twill, 2/2 as far as can be seen, count 16/12-13.

Bronze buckle

Fragment of leather belt, 3 cm long, 2.2 wide, with three rivet holes. Fragment tablet weave with leather on both sides, 1.5 cm long, width of 1.0 cm preserved under the leather; thread Z spun, 4-hole tablet-twists Z and S (chevrons) 8 tablets per 5 mm., 14-16 wefts per cm; end of double Z thread sticking out, perhaps a sewing thread. This could have been a tablet-braid belt with reinforced leather ends. Front of buckle, small traces Z spun textile.

Replaced on pin and some tiny fragments, 2.0 X 0.8 cm in curve, Z,Z, twill, similar to that on other pin.

Grave 547

Shield boss (715092)

Fragment textile, replaced on iron, 1.3 X 1.4 cm; Z,Z, twill, 2/2 with one double thread, count 9/8 per cm.

Grave 548

Bronze brooch (715187)

On bronze: fragment replaced plain weave, 0.5 X 0.4, Z,Z, 9/8 threads. From pin: fine replaced textile in at least 4 layers, area 2.3 X 1.6 cm; Z,Z, plain weave, count 18-19/18 per cm, pulled diagonally.

Grave 550

Prir small bronze saucer brooches

Back: on both, round pin heads, deteriorated replaced textile, Z,Z.

Grave 551

Iron buckle (715068)

Underside: area replaced textile, seems to be in a double fold, area 1.6 X 1.3 cm; Z,Z, surface too deteriorated for identification, probably plain.

Grave 552

Small square plate brooch

Back of pin: area replaced textile, 1.3 X 0.9 cm; Z,Z, twill, 2/2 as far as can be seen, count c.12/10 per cm.

Iron ring (715048)

Deteriorated fragments replaced textile, probably same as that still adhering to ring; best piece 2.2 X 1.5 cm, with traces of second and third folds on top; Z,Z, twill 2/2, count 14/10 per cm.

Iron buckle & plate (715049)

Fragments replaced textile on ring of buckle and plate, best areas 1.0 X 0.7, 1.0 X 0.8 cm; Z,Z, regular fine 2/2 twill, count c.12/12 per cm.

Iron key (715051)

A number of fragments replaced textile from parts of the key, all probably from same weave, good areas 1.0 X 0.8 cm; Z,Z, fine 2/2 twill, count 8/6 on 5 mm, thread rather uneven in weft.

Coin, RB, used as pendant

Bronze toilet set and ring (715194)
On face of pendant, fragment textile, 1.0 X 0.8 cm; dark brown, Z,Z, 2/2
twill, count 13/14 per cm. Recognisable deteriorated patches of same weave on most parts of toilet set; probably same as on RB coin. HMA. Very badly degraded, but could be of animal origin.
5-6 strands of Z spun thread in hole of pendant, to attach it.

Buckle, strap end and plate (715193)
Remains of belt, almost completely replaced, at least 2 cm wide; Z,Z, plain weave, count 14/10 per cm. HMA. Possibly vegetable fibre.
The belt is a little wide for the buckle, and went through it in folds, present also on both sides of the iron plate; on the two fragments against the plate the edge is turned over, but it is impossible to see if the s lvedge is preserved.

i.e. c.10/10 per cm; (b) 0.6 X 0.5, Z,Z, plain weave, folded, count 9/8 on

Fragment replaced twill, Z,Z, 0.5 X 0.4 cm.

Applied brooch

One side; clear area c.3.0 X 1.0 cm, replaced, Z,Z, 2/2 twill, count 13/10. Other side: mixed grass stems and deteriorated textile.

Bronze brooch (715394)

Areas textile both sides of brooch, dark brown, front 0.8 X 0.7 and smaller patches, back 1.0 % 0.9 and smaller patch, both same fabric, Z,Z, 2/2 twill, count 14/12. HMA. Fine animal fibres; almost certainly wool.

Grave 643

Bronze end of square-headed brooch used as pendant Front: area 2.0 X 0.7, mostly replaced, traces fine twill, Z,Z, too small and deteriorated for count. Detached fragments: (a) 0.5 X 1.0, two layers fabric, the underneath one probably from the replaced patch on the front, fine Z,Z, twill; above this very coarse threads, Z,Z, seem to be two shades Latch lifter
Area replaced textile (impression) over 4.5 X 1.3 cm on the ring, Z,Z, fine, probably plain weave.

Grave 648

Small square headed brooch

Front: deteriorated Z,Z textile. Back: by pin head, lying alongside, 1.5 cm plaited Z threads, probably 6. Area 1.0 X 0.6 cm tablet twists, 4-hole, 5 tablets per 5 mm; two Z twists, or Sply threads, preserved round the other side of the pin head.

Pair to brooch

Front: area c.1.5 X 1.0, deteriorated fine Z,Z, plain weave, count 9/9 on 5 mm.

Buckle

Front of buckle, area 1.7 % 0.6 textile, Z,Z, too ragged for identification. HMA. Animal fibre.

Knife (715134)

From broken piece, replaced fragment 0.7 % 0.4, Z,Z, plain weave, count 7/4-5 on 5 mm.

Iron object with hook (latch lifter?) (715135)

Traces replaced textile on most pieces, one clear area 2.5 X 1.2 cm;
Z,Z, 2/2 twill, very regular, count 14/12 per cm.

Grave 649

Bronze buckle (715244)

Fragment detached textile, 0.8 X 1.0 cm, Z,Z, 2/2 twill, count 8/6 on 5 mm; there are traces on the top of the buckle that probably come from this.

HMA. fibre unidentifiable.

Back of buckle, traces textile with probable Z and S threads. Leather belt.

Grave 662

Spearhead (715357)

On ferrule, replaced textile, area 3.5 X 1.4 cm, parts very deteriorated, but seems to be a fine tablet weave border or band, 4-thread tablet, Z spun, all twists lying S c.11-12 per cm, weft S or Sply, 10 per cm; perhaps a braid used as a loop.

Grave 666

1ron buckle (715359)

Fragment c. 0.7 X 0.5 cm, replaced twill, Z,Z, not clear enough for count.

Grave 672

Bronze buckle and rivets (715397)

Traces deteriorated Z textile; this looks like leather, but HMA. found no leather, but animal fibres, probably wool, both fine and fairly coarse, the latter being medullated.

Grave 690

Iron pin (715362)

Replaced textile in folds all over surface, largest piece 2.0 X 1.8 cm; Z,Z, 2/2 twill, counts 12/11, 13/11 per cm.

Button brooch (715400)

Back: replaced textile, several layers lying in folds, whole of one end of the brooch, (a) Z,Z, plain weave, fine, count 9/9 on 5 mm; on top of this (i.e. lying underneath) area that may be different (b), looser with some very coarse threads, but may be (a) d teriorated, count 8/6 on 5 mm.

(c) One 4- thread tablet-twist, 0.8 cm long, 11 weft ends protruding, warp Z, weft Sply.

Grave 692

Iron buckle (715366)

Area replaced textile 2.0 X 0.9, more like an earth replacement than iron, Z,Z, 2/2 twill, count 12/11 per cm.

Strap end (715406)
Patch on strap end, c.O.E X O.E, Z,Z, and detached lumps, the best 2.5 X 1.4, lying against the bronze, Z,Z, twill, count 16/12 per cm, but very pulled and surface deteriorated. HMA. Fine animal fibres, could be wool.

Grave 764

Iron buckle (715380)
Area 1.0 x 0.7, replaced; Z,Z, twill, probably 2/2, count 11/10, threads broken and displaced.

Grave 766

Sword (715348)
Textile replaced, lying across top of scabbard, clear area 6.0 X 2.5 cm; Z,Z, 2/2 twill, count c.14/10-12 per cm, regular spinning and weaving.

Grave 767

Bronze brooch (715402)

Front: (a) area 2.5 X 2.0, at one end, Z,Z, plain weave, count 7/8 on 5 mm.

HMA. Vegetable fibres, possibly flax.

(b) at other end and middle, area 5.0 X 2.0 cm, dark brown textile, with fold or trace of second layer, Z,Z, 2/2 twill, counts 17/12-13, 16/14 per cm.

HMA. Animal fibres, possibly wool, mostly fine but a few coarser medullated fibres were also present.

Replaced lump from pin, (c) 2.0 X 2.0, included 4-hole tablet twists in Z thread with Sply wefts 6 to 5 mm, and some of (a) plain weave.

Bronze brooch (pair) (715403)
Tiny fragments plain weave (a), undyed, Z,Z, count 6/6 on 5 mm; traces of same fabric deteriorated scattered over surface of brooch, with traces of dark brown threads from (b) twill; replaced lump as in pair, made up of (a) and (c) tablet twists lying S.

Detached fragments of textile from the brooches, dark brown threads from (b) friable mass of deteriorated (a) and Splyed threads from (c) tablet twists or fringe. In one detached lump (from 71403 pin) it appears as if the tablet weave may have been patterned, as there is a suggestion of Sply threads on the surface, and another layer of coarse Sply thread made with a number of Z threads protruding from underneath.

Knife (715405)
Fragment replaced textile, 1.0 X 0.8 cm; Z,Z, 2/2 twill count est.12-13/12.

Iron pin (715384)
Two replaced textiles, (a) scrap 0.8 X 0.6, Z,Z, fine plain weave, 9/8 on 5 mm.
(b) c.3.0 X 1.0, Z,Z, 2/2 twill, count 14/12-13; probably same as on the brooches.

&rave 773

Iron brooch (715377)
On piece with ?pin, replaced textile impression, 2.5 X 1.5, Z,Z, 2/2 twill, count 12/12 per cm. On other fragment, replaced plain weave, Z,Z, count 10/10 per cm,

Knife (715387)
Traces on most fragments, one clear 1.5 X 1.2, replaced, Z,Z, 2/2 twill, fine regular, count 17/14 per cm.

Grave 775

Knife (715390)
Replaced areas, largest 2.0 X 2.0 on blade, probably earth replacement;
(a) Z,Z, 2/2 twill, count 16/12 per cm. Another area, 2.0 X 1.0, with only one system of Z threads preserved (b) could be from fringe, but possibly the other has decayed. A second layer of textile under (a) and also visible on the other side of the knife blade, may be plain weave; under this there are plant stems.

The two-colour weave from Grave 123 is an interesting fabric. With so little preserved it is obviously impossible to conjecture if the whole fabric was covered with this small check pattern. Coarse Z threads from Grave 643 also seemed to be in two shades of brown, but unfortunately were not sufficiently well preserved or numerous enough for the fibre to be identified.

There is no parallel to this piece from British sites; two fragments, both also using two shades of naturally pigmented wools, have so far been recorded, but both are twills - the Falkirk tartan, 3rd cent.A.D. (1), herringbone 2/2 twill with dark stripes in warp and weft forming checks, and Broomfield Barrow textile B3, 6th-7th cent., 2/2 twill with irregular light and dark stripes. In both these, as in the Mucking piece, the spinning is Z.

Checked weaves were popular in the north during the pre-Roman and Roman Iron Ages, and John Peter Wild has suggested convincingly that they were the scutulata of the Gauls (2). A number of examples of two-colour checks have been found in Scandinavian excavations, again twill weaves (3) with S-spinning in the earlier pieces; however, from the late Roman town at Mainz, as well as twills, a piece in Z spun two-colour plain weave check is also recorded (4), and this, so far, is the nearest parallel to the Mucking piece.


Shield



Grave 249

Iron knife (690950)
Replaced textile, areas 1.8 X 1.4 cm, and smaller fragment round
edge, Z,Z, twill, count c.12/12, but surface deteriorated.




Fig. 3. Scarc
